

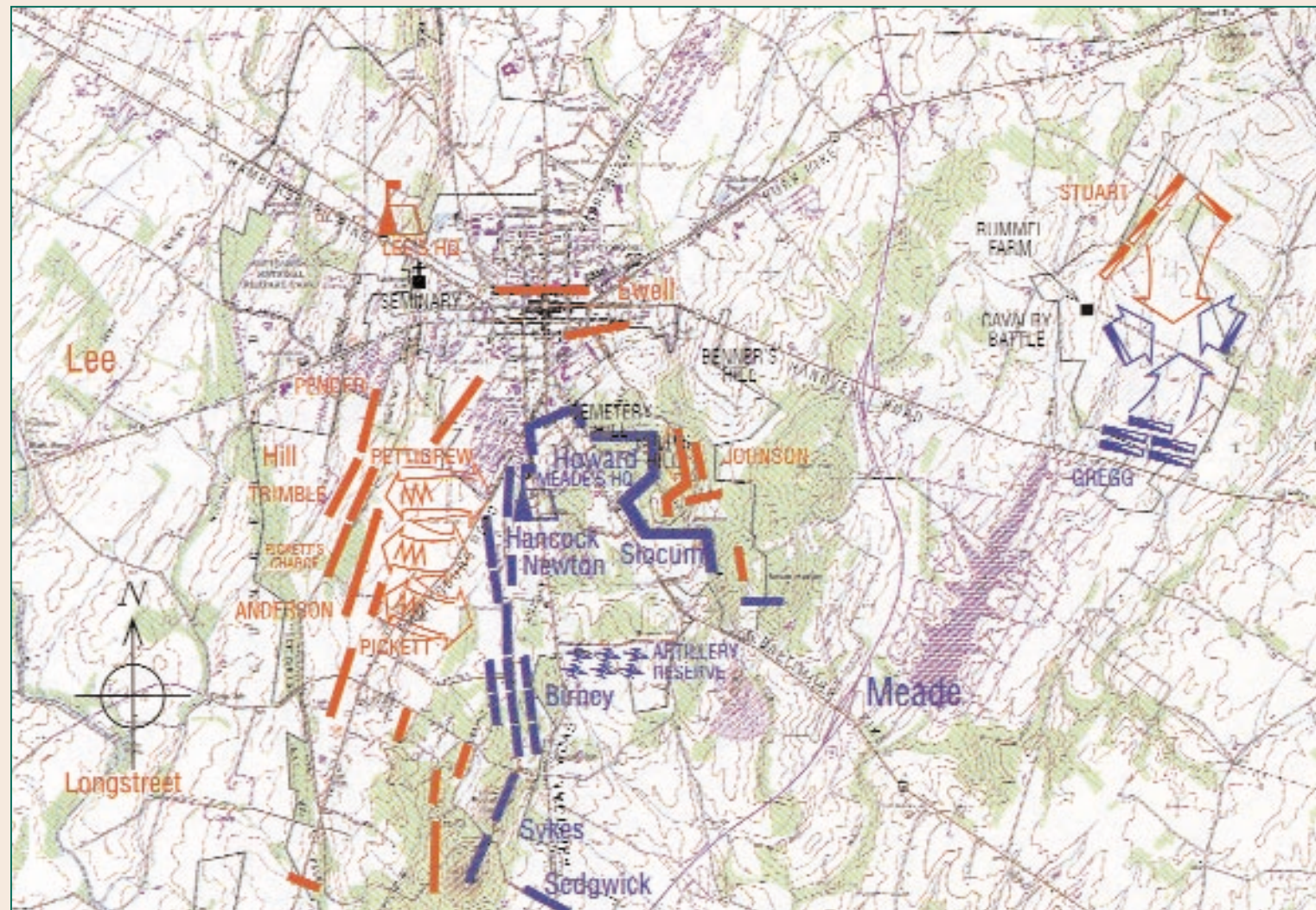

GETTYSBURG NATIONAL MILITARY PARK, PENNSYLVANIA

The Conservation Fund's partnership with the Friends of the National Parks at Gettysburg has made possible the preservation—through the purchase of both easements and fee—of four critical properties on the historic battlefield. The Conservation Fund provided bridge financing for the purchases from its Battlefield Revolving Fund, established by grants from The Gilder Foundation.

The Revolving Fund made possible the purchase and donation by the Friends of the National Parks at Gettysburg to Gettysburg National Military Park of easements over:

- 28 acres on East Cavalry Field in partnership with Adams County;
- 23 acres of the Blocher Farm;
- historic land adjacent to the park along the Baltimore Pike.

The Revolving Fund enabled the partnership to purchase a motel built in the area of Pickett's Charge and to hold it until federal funding made possible its purchase by the National Park Service and the restoration of the historic landscape.
